Dan Strong Receives 2013 Larry A. Conrad Civic Service Award

INDIANAPOLIS – The Indiana Association of Cities and Towns (IACT) announced that Dan Strong of Cicero has been awarded the **2013 IACT Larry A. Conrad Civic Service Award**. This award honors the contributions made by private citizens, companies or civic organizations to municipal government. Strong received his award during the Presidents' Reception, on Oct. 7, at the 2013 IACT Annual Conference & Exhibition in Indianapolis.

"Dan Strong was chosen for this honor based upon his passion for Cicero, selfless sense of services, and commitment to making the community a better place to live and work," said IACT Executive Director and CEO Matt Greller. "Through his service on many boards, such as the Fire Department Merit Board, Planning Commission, Board of Zoning Appeals and Redevelopment Commission, Dan's reach goes deep into the town," said Greller.

Strong and his wife Terri have been residents of Cicero for more than 15 years. Strong is the owner of the local McDonalds, which gives him a catalyst for sponsoring local community events, offering free food and water to emergency personnel in urgent times, helping feed families displaced during fires, securing youth related grants and much more. Strong's volunteer service has helped the Board of the Hope Clinic whose mission is to serve the medical needs of uninsured and underinsured families in Cicero and Hamilton County.



In its 37th year, the IACT Annual Awards program, presented by Umbaugh, recognizes communities and individuals in municipal government for excellence and outstanding achievement. A nine-member panel of qualified judges selected this year's winners from a competitive field of nominees from around the state.
