Goshen's Pottinger - Stutzman Family Receive 2014 Larry A. Conrad Civic Service Award

FORT WAYNE – The Indiana Association of Cities and Towns (IACT) announced Dave and Faye Pottinger and Maija and Jeremy Stutzman were the recipients of the **2014 IACT Larry A. Conrad Civic Service Award**. This award honors the contributions made by private citizens, companies or civic organizations to municipal government. The family received their award during the Presidents' Reception, on Sept. 10, at the 2014 IACT Annual Conference & Exhibition in Fort Wayne.

Goshen Mayor Allan Kauffman nominated the family due to their untiring commitment to the city through the number of historic buildings they have renovated in order to return them to useable and functional spaces. In addition to their commitment for preserving Goshen's history, the family has also worked with the City of Goshen to add streetscape features, such as bump-outs for outdoor dining, brick planters, bike racks and more. The family gives back in other ways through regular representation on the City's downtown business improvement district board and Jeremy's service on the Goshen City Council.

I simply couldn't think of a better representation of private citizens who are willing to give so much to their community, so consistently, and with so much passion.
