Kokomo Mayor Greg Goodnight Elected 2016 IACT President

Evansville's Lloyd Winnecke and Nashville's Brenda Young Elected as Officers

FRENCH LICK, IN. – The Indiana Association of Cities and Towns (IACT) announced today that Kokomo Mayor Greg Goodnight has been elected to succeed Terre Haute's Duke Bennett in 2016 as the group's president. Goodnight was elected by the membership at IACT's 2015 Annual Conference and Exhibition held this week in French Lick.

Also elected were Evansville Mayor Lloyd Winnecke who will serve as 1st Vice President and Nashville Clerk-Treasurer Brenda Young to serve as 2nd Vice President. All three take office January 1, 2016.
