Prior approval does not need to be obtained to attend a program outside of Indiana except in cases where the judicial officer seeks a scholarship from the Indiana Supreme Court's professional development scholarship program.

Generally, a judge would just register for the program and pay an associated registration fee, if one is charged.

The key to obtaining continuing legal or judicial attendance credit in Indiana is whether the sponsor and program in question have received accreditation in Indiana by the Indiana Commission for Continuing Legal Education.

The judicial officer would need to check with the Commission to see if the sponsor/course in question is accredited. If the sponsor/program isn't, there is an application that the judicial officer can submit to the Commission to get the program accredited for Indiana CJE/CLE credit.
