## **WPC Laboratory Technician**

The City of Auburn Water Pollution Control Department is seeking a hard-working, self-motivated individual to join our team as a full time <u>Laboratory Technician</u>. This position primarily assists with collection and analysis of wastewater samples to ensure environmental compliance with regulations, using standard methods and technology. The ideal candidate should have a strong work ethic, excellent problem solving skills, ability to perform moderately complex mathematical equations, be motivated to serve others, and enjoy working in a fast-paced environment.

### Essential Duties/Skills/Responsibilities/Qualifications

- Collects and prepares samples for analysis, using approved methods and technology and complying with the department quality control program and chemical hygiene plan.
- Sets up and operates moderately complex analytical equipment, ensures that equipment is properly calibrated, and performs periodic equipment maintenance.
- Chemically analyzes plant and industrial wastewater and provides reports of analyses to management.
- Prepares chemical reagents.
- Performs routine general chemistry and microbiological analyses, including-pH, BOD, solids, dissolved oxygen, ammonia, phosphorus, and chlorine residual.
- Ensures that glassware, lab, and benchtops are clean.
- Ensures that samples are prepared for analysis at contract lab(s).
- Maintains reliable and accurate chain-of-custody documents for all sample materials charged to laboratory operations.
- Assures complete and legible records of all functions within operations of the lab division.
- Assists in maintaining inventories of required lab materials.
- Must learn and follow the procedure for setting up and maintaining samplers.
- Enters laboratory records into computer system, providing department management with reliable and accurate information.
- Provides input to WPC Industrial Pretreatment Monitoring Programs and NPDES Permit compliance activity, as required and must fully understand their intent for the City of Auburn.
- Follows all City of Auburn policies and procedures in addition to all local, state, and federal standards, regulations, and safety rules.
- May be required to complete certification(s) and/or additional training courses.
- Must minimally possess a High School diploma or equivalent.
- Possess a valid Driver's License with acceptable driving record.
- Requires working in and around chemicals and other unpleasant odors, gases and fumes.
