# Vaccine pop-up clinic in Gary

(You must be an Indiana resident and show proof of age. That can be a photo *ID* or other document, such as a utility bill, bank statement, lease agreement or record from your doctor with your address and date of birth.)

#### New high-risk groups eligible

The Indiana Department of Health has expanded the list of individuals with high-risk conditions who are now eligible for vaccination. Hoosiers can review the **complete eligibility list.** These patients are identified by their physicians and will receive notification via text or email with a unique registration link. (Patients should contact their provider if they have not received notice of eligibility.)






Total Individuals who have received a First Dose:

#### **Total first doses**




#### **Total individuals Fully Vaccinated**


- 72% of Hoosiers 80+
