Delta variant update

This variant of the virus that causes COVID-19 is on the rise in Indiana. Here are some things to know:

- It's highly transmissible, with 70% more infections than the Alpha variant
- Reports from hospitals state patients are now younger with fewer underlying health conditions
- There is no compelling data that infection is more severe

Updated: Fact sheets for Johnson & Johnson

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) added a warning to the [fact sheet](#) for Johnson & Johnson's (Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine, due to a rare occurrence of [Guillain-Barré syndrome](#), an auto-immune disorder that attacks the body's nerves. Warning signs include numbness or tingling in the feet that spreads to the upper body. The FDA reports that 12.5 million doses of Johnson & Johnson vaccine have been administered, and 100 cases of Guillain-Barré have been reported. Vaccination against COVID-19 is still highly recommended.



Vaccines for the homebound – just call 211!

Homebound Hoosiers is a program to deliver COVID-19 vaccines to Hoosiers who cannot leave their homes. This program is now accessed by simply calling 211. Agents will coordinate vaccine appointments with the [Indiana Immunization Coalition](#) and its partners.

 - 211 can also arrange a free voucher for transportation to and from the clinic, from the rideshare service Uber.
- Free rides to vaccine clinics are also offered by IU Health. Call 1.888.IUHEALTH (1.888.484.3258) and choose option 9.




Total Individuals Fully Vaccinated*

Here are the latest percentages of people who are fully vaccinated by age group. These percentages include residents and staff in long-term care facilities.
