### Participation and Recognition in City Leadership

All Indiana mayors are strongly encouraged to attend at least two Mayors Institute sessions each year. Aim and ICI will award mayors a Certificate of Achievement in three levels. Achievement will be measured by participation and attendance at the Mayors Institute sessions. Additionally, mayors that have reached Indiana City Leadership Ambassador status are eligible for an advanced level: Indiana City Leadership Executive. ### Mayors Idea Exchange

How do you get residents to want to help themselves and each other? Seymour Mayor Matt Nicholson will be speaking about two programs he and his staff have implemented that are doing just that. The Curb Appeal Program launched in 2021 provides qualifying residents a matching grant reimbursement up to \$500 to make visual improvements to the front of their homes and yards. To date, \$14,500 has been distributed and resulted in total investment of \$121,580 in curb appeal projects. The Seymour Shares TimeBank, launched just a few months ago, is a platform that is connecting neighbors and meeting needs in the community. Time credits are earned for every hour of service completed and can then be used to pay for services the volunteer needs, creating a circle of paying it forward. To date, there are 81 members and over 20 hours of service exchanged.
