The End of Cheap Money and How the Treasurer of State's Office Can Help

The recent rise of interest rates creates challenges and opportunities for municipalities, impacting both the investment and borrowing of funds. More critical now than over the past decade, cities and towns must think strategically about how they manage their cash and raise capital to fund projects. This workshop will cover various facets of support the Treasurer of State's Office can provide in a higher interest rate environment through the Public Deposit Insurance Fund (PDIF), TrustINdiana, and the Indiana Bond Bank, specifically addressing: 1) How municipalities can earn interest income on their deposits, 2) Understanding the impact of market turmoil on banks, recent bank failures, and how the PDIF provides additional insurance on deposited funds, and 3) Options that are available through the Indiana Bond Bank to obtain lower borrowing costs and maintain capital access in a tighter lending environment.

The Mental Health Impact of the Opioid Epidemic and How Communities are Facing the Challenge

A panel moderated by Mayor Steve McMichael will discuss the tragic effects of substance use disorders, including significant mental health consequences for all involved. Clinton Faupel and Chad Bauer will share their experiences grappling with the opioid epidemic. As a Fort Wayne Fire Department Captain, Chad Bauer has spent his career responding to emergencies. He will share his story of the aftermath of his 20-year-old son's accidental fentanyl overdose, how this tragic event affected his career, his family, and his personal mental health, and how he has used his experience to advocate for those in similar circumstances. As Executive Director of RemedyLIVE, Clinton Faupel, knows the firsthand how devastating the statistics of opioid addiction are. He will share stories about fentanyl's effects on the state and offer ways every community can address tragic overdose trends. Finally, state leaders will be on hand to discuss diverse ways communities across Indiana are using opioid settlement funds to find a better way forward.

How has Covid-19 Impacted Hoosier Employment Trends?

Manufacturing has a long and strong history in Indiana. The state remains highest in its share of GDP in manufacturing, but what does this mean in terms of manufacturing employment, on which many of our policies are based? In this session Ball State researchers will explore employment trends in our communities, including the impacts of remote work, automation, and education. Speakers will also explore the implications of these trends on both municipal and private sector hiring decisions and policy impacts to be considered.

Don't take a Pass: Not Understanding Technology is No Excuse to Avoid the Cyber Security Talk

Not everyone is a technology guru or understands the world of terabytes, the dark web, or ransomware. Unfortunately, that doesn't mean we can put off discovering what we need to know to protect the digital environment of our municipalities. This workshop will cover common cybersecurity threats and foundational security controls that organizations should consider implementing. In addition, this session will walk participants through incident response preparation. Participants will learn to identify cybersecurity risks, build remediation and mitigation plans, and develop a stronger cybersecurity posture.
