IOT will present on techniques and services proven to help prevent cybersecurity threats and attacks. The services and techniques discussed are listed in the State's Cybersecurity Plan approved by the Federal Department of Homeland Security and are available to local governments at a low fee or free of charge. To receive a portion of the \$20M of federal funds, local governments are encouraged to meet cybersecurity best practices before applying – including .GOV domain, secure websites and emails, a Cybersecurity Incident Reporter contact information on file with IOT, cybersecurity training, password management, and more.</p>
