#### Crisis Communications: Planning for What You Hope Never Happens

There was a time when crisis preparedness was something only the leaders of global capitals needed to concern themselves with, but no longer. In today's world, officials in every community – regardless of size or geography – need to be prepared to lead residents through a crisis. Whether a crisis is natural or manmade, effective communication with the public is imperative to navigating these challenges. In fact, timely, accurate, empathetic public engagement often determines the success or failure of a comprehensive crisis response. In this presentation, our panel of communications professionals and public servants will explore best practices in crisis communication including considerations how you prepare, who says what and when, and what tools are most effective with specific audiences. Panelists, including Greenwood Mayor Mark Myers, will share their perspectives on leading their communities through a crisis and what leasens others can draw from their experiences. Participants will leave this session with ideas and concrete action steps they can take back to their home communities.

#### The Latest on PFAS and PFOA Requirements and the Lead Line Replacement Rule Impacting All Water Systems

This workshop will provide a high-level review of the new national drinking water regulation of PFAS and the impact on all water systems. PFAS are a class of manmade chemicals that tend to persist in the environment. Background will be provided on what PFAS are, where they come from, and why they are regulated. The content will also include actions that all water systems need to take to comply with the new regulations: perform monitoring and reporting for PFAS and reduce the amount of PFAS in drinking water. Participants will learn about the requirements, timing, and legislation relative to lead line replacement.

#### The Future of Indiana's Legislative Landscape: Setting the Stage for Comprehensive Dialogue

In this panel discussion, we will explore the intricacies of proposed legislative measures in Indiana. Our discussion will center on recent talks about caping the maximum levy growth quotient, a measure that could significantly alter the financial landscape for municipalities. Speakers will explore the components of this potential legislation, including the expected impact on budgeting, taxes, and revenues, with a particular focus on local income taxes. These taxes are the essence of local funding, and understanding their utilization is crucial for informed discourse with legislators. Also, up for discussion will be the allocation of expenditure rates across different counties and the rationale behind these decisions. Finally, our panel will talk about recent candidate proposals to eliminate Indiana's income tax. This workshop will provide valuable perspectives and help you develop strategic talking points for engaging with legislators and municipal representatives on these critical issues. The goal is to foster a comprehensive understanding of the legislative proposals and their far-reaching effects on Indiana's fiscal policy.
